



# Ms. Laurie's PreK/TK Owletes

#### **Materials List:**

Families that have chosen a virtual preschool experience are responsible for providing their child with materials needed for learning. It is crucial that the children have the supplies needed to participate in the planned lessons alongside their peers.

\*The following learning materials can be found at the 99Cents Store or Dollar Tree. Some items I will ask you to gather from outside nature walks such as leaves, twigs, feathers, grass. Others you may have at home. Each week, I will provide a lesson plan with the materials needed for the upcoming week.

I box of traditional assorted color crayons (thin or thick)

I box of traditional assorted color chubby markers, optional/additional thin markers I box of traditional assorted color pencils

A few regular sized lead pencils and a few Chubby pencils. \*Chubbies are great for young hands, but often need a special sharpener!

Pencil sharpener (for lead and colored...)

I box of traditional color dry erase markers

I double sided white board with writing lines/blank or clear pocket with lined paper I dry eraser

1 tray of watercolor paint

I packet of multicolor construction paper

Lots of plain white paper (I save my junk mail for this purpose, its

FREE!) I packet of large lined writing paper (we can cut this into strips)

I child sized scissor (right or left as per your child's dominant

hand) I bottle of glue

1 pack of glue stick

Alphabet letters (foam, magnet, whatever you can find...)

Numbers 1-10

Deck of old cards (without Kings, Queens, Jacks or Aces.) Great for early addition!) 10-100 buttons, beans, pebbles, pennies, or other finger sized items similar for counting

ı Bean Bag (you can make your own)

1 tub of playdough

# Things to Look Out For and/or Save for Art:

For Collaging: save any small items that can be glued to paper: tissue paper, wrapping paper, glitter, scraps of old yarn, ribbons, feathers, pleated coffee filters, confetti, pompoms, leaves, fake flowers, bubble wrap, basic white paper plates, toilet paper rolls, googly eyes etc.! Save plastic containers from food items (I use these for my water when painting or for storing my collected collage materials.)

# Other Things to Remember:

- -Students need a quiet place to work and focus. They need supplies within hand.
- -In order to be marked present, your child must be on-screen live during the entire class.
- -No eating during live instruction. Water is ok!
- -Help your child learn to "wait" for their turn, use the mute/unmute and raise hand function. I will not answer students who call out.
- -I will provide 10-15 minutes after class is finished to speak 1st with parents, then children who would like a little 1:1 interaction.
- -Try to let your children answer for themselves and share their own ideas. Some have language barriers. In this case, parents may support translation, but encourage English speaking.
